The Future of our Locktaorians

As the principal of Lock Tao Secondary School, I focus on students' academic performance, moral character and Christian value. Our school's motto is "Honesty, Faith, Goodness and Diligence". Every morning, when I greet my students, I imagine the day when they graduate in our school. What kind of students would they be? What values and characters should they have to hold and maintain for the rest of their life? I shared my vision with my colleagues. After a long discussion, we finally set the following six qualities, namely, self-discipline, loving others, perseverance, resilience, be reliable and be responsible. We sow the seeds of these six qualities in our students' hearts in three years, but these seeds take years to grow. These qualities start from inside out, in line with the Confucianism, "Cultivate yourself, regulate your family, manage the nation, to bring peace to the world."

Self-discipline and Loving others

In the first year, we help our students to understand what "Self-discipline and Loving others" really are. I think the most challenging task in the world is to understand and supervise ourselves, which is a life-long mission. Besides, loving others with your heart and with actions requires a lot of effort and care. As the Bible said, **"Have love for the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind; and for your neighbour as for yourself."** Luke 10: 27.

Perseverance and Resilience

The qualities for the second year are "Perseverance and Resilience". Students will face different difficulties and challenges when they enter their workplace. They need incomparable will and perseverance, and resilience can make them not give up easily when they encounter problems. As the Bible said, **"Have no fear and do not be troubled; for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."** Joshua 1:9.

Reliable and Responsible

"Reliable and Responsible" are the qualities for the third year. I hope that my students can be faithful and do their best in every position. Whether they are students, teachers, or whatever positions are, they should take the responsibilities. Only when they can be the responsible and reliable people will they be trusted by others. Duty and obligations are always heavy, but God can help you. As the Bible said, **"Come to me, all you who are troubled and weighted down with care, and I will give you rest."** Matthew 11:28.

These qualities are not only good for my students, but also my colleagues and parents. Here is my prayer for all of you: "May God hear you in your time of need. May He run to help you and uplift you out of any kind of trouble or despair. May God give you peace and victory on every side. Amen."

BEYOND TESTING AND GRADING

Systematic data collection and record keeping are crucial for reflection, review and evaluation. For ten years, we have introduced the practice of e-portfolios. We keep records of each student's written work and oral presentations since S1. Over the years, students can review their work and witness their progress. Teachers use the e-portfolios to understand their students' needs, as well as to guide them to reflect and set goals. E-Portfolios have greatly facilitated vertical coherence in curriculum planning and self-directed learning. In addition to keeping e-portfolios, we have taken advantage of e-learning tools with instant feedback and statistical analysis. In the past few years, we have incorporated diagnostic pre-and post-tests at the junior secondary levels to inform pedagogical decisions. At the beginning of each term, English teachers would stock-take the grammar and vocabulary items they plan to cover and design a short test using Google Form with all relevant items. Students complete the assessment before and after the period of instruction. Data generated (e.g. mean, attainment rate) will help teachers adjust the teaching focus and pace and evaluate the teaching effectiveness. We find the electronic tests very cost-effective, as comprehensive data are generated for teachers' reference automatically.



With the continuous collection and effective management of assessment data, we can easily present a full picture of students' learning progression and show them how far they have come from S1. Parents see their children's growth from the learning evidence and begin to show more recognition and support. In reviewing peers' work, students learn to show appreciation and make constructive feedback to encourage each other to break through and move forward. The assessment data we collect over the years really help to showcase students' achievements, build greater self-efficacy and grit in English learning.

Our curriculum and assessment practices are designed with psychology of learning in mind. We hope to craft an empowering learning journey that changes students' perception of themselves and English learning.

Students learn best when there are positive emotions and accomplishments in the learning process. We try to engineer such experiences by creating a signature activity at each year for students to "shine". For example, in S1, we have a multiple-intelligences project involving a study tour to Heyuan. In this cross-curricular project, students apply the knowledge they have acquired in different subjects to solve problems in the Heyuan visit. At the end of the project, students do a group presentation in English to reflect on their learning experiences. Similarly, in S2, drama is the highlight to be imprinted in every student's mind. Students undergo a series of lessons that focus on script writing, speech delivery, acting, dancing and singing skills. They then stage a musical where everybody has a role to play. Parents are invited to help and watch the performance to witness their children's growth. We capture the memorable moments front and back stage in the programme booklet and no student is left out. This serves as a memento of their fun learning experience in Lock Tao.

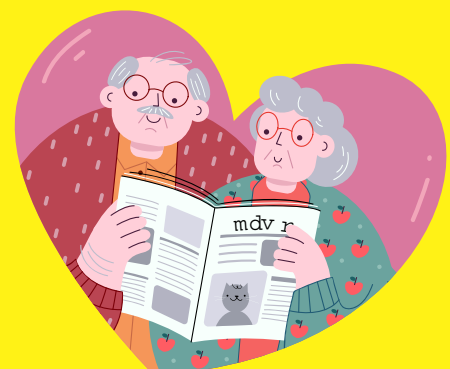

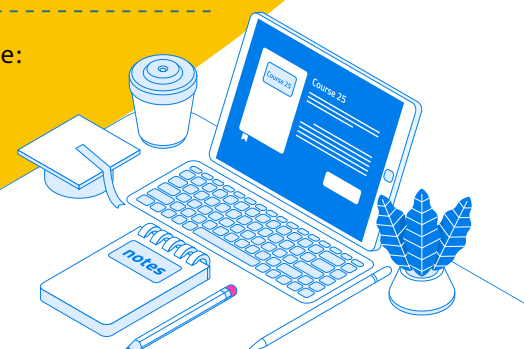
